Pumpkin Cookies w/Cream Cheese

Ingredients

- 2 c. all purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp. ground ginger
- 1 c. butter
- 3/4 c. white sugar
- 3/4 c. brown sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 egg
- 1 (15 oz) can pumpkin puree

- 1 (3 oz.) pkg cream cheese softened
- 1/4 c. butter softened
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 2 c. confectioners sugar

Directions

Preheat oven to 350, lightly grease baking sheets. Sift together flour, baking powder, cinnamon, baking soda, nutmeg and ginger. In a separate bowl cream butter, white sugar, brown sugar, vanilla and egg, beating until smooth. Add in pumpkin puree. Once combined, slowly add in dry ingredients. Spoon batter into baking sheets, bake for 10-15 minutes. Once slightly cooled, remove from sheet and move to waxed paper to completely cool. Beat together first 3 ingredients of frosting recipe, then add in confectioners sugar slowly. Add to cookie (either as frosting, or as filling!) Enjoy! (**)
